

## **Healthcare Transportation Services**

Patients may require transportation for their non-emergent medical needs, including:

Medical treatments

Pharmacy visits

· Preventive care visits

Outpatient surgery

Follow-up appointments

#### Programs offering assistance with healthcare transportation may be available in your area.

- Speak with a healthcare provider office to determine if they offer assistance with transportation either by directly providing a ride or by offering vouchers for transportation services

#### Medicaid<sup>1</sup>

Patients with Medicaid coverage may have their healthcare transportation covered by their Medicaid benefits.

- Federal regulations require state Medicaid programs to provide necessary transportation to and from providers, although methods of transportation vary by state
- Patients will be provided with information on scheduling a ride to appointments when they enroll in Medicaid

# Private Health Insurance



Private insurance companies may offer healthcare transportation options, including coverage of rideshare services or reimbursement of transportation expenses, however benefits and requirements vary greatly between plans.

#### Medicare<sup>2</sup>

Medicare Part A and B (Original Medicare) does not typically cover non-emergent medical transportation.

- Some cases may be covered if deemed necessary by a healthcare provider, but may depend on the specific situation and plan
- Medicare Advantage plans typically provide more access to transportation benefits, although each plan differs in coverage

# CMS Guiding an Improved Dementia Experience (GUIDE) Model<sup>3</sup>

Nationwide model that supports Medicare recipients living with dementia and their caregivers by requiring providers to offer standardized care and services like transportation.

#### **Veteran Programs**

Veterans may be able to obtain healthcare transportation through volunteer programs or programs provided by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs (VA).

- The <u>Veterans Transportation Program (VTP)</u> provides veterans with transportation to and from VA healthcare facilities and authorized non-VA healthcare appointments
- Find medical transportation for veterans to VA medical facilities by searching for your facility on the <u>DAV Hospital Service Coordinator Directory</u> and contacting the hospital service coordinator

#### **Local Services**

Patients in need of transportation services may receive aid from local services and programs.

#### Regional government

Local towns, cities, counties, and other regional entities may provide healthcare transportation for the community. These include "taxi vouchers", where eligible riders receive low cost or free rides from providers such as dial-a-ride, taxi and on-demand services, agency vans, or volunteer drivers.

#### Paratransit<sup>4</sup>

While public transit may be an option for some patients who need healthcare transportation, the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requires that complementary paratransit services be available to people who cannot use fixed route services due to a disability.

· Eligibility requirements are determined by the transit system used and the local community
